CONTINUING EDUCATION

Foresters are offered 9 hours of SAF-CFE credit by attending the lectures specified:

8 hours in Category I-CF

1 hour in Category I-FCA (Forestry Ethics)



A maximum of 8.0 hours in Category 1-CF may be earned by attending all five classes offered in the continuing education tents (5 hours), and the field presentations *GPS Applications* (1.5 hours) and *Operator Select Thinning* (1.5 hours). Friday's presentations will be repeated on Saturday, September 20, however, additional credit may not be earned by attending the same class more than once.

(Category 1-FCA credit) by attending Forestry Ethics on Friday (1 hour) at 2:00 pm.
